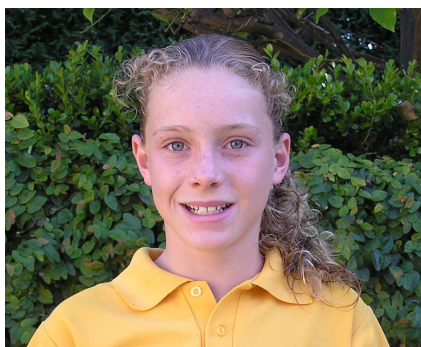

Coaches News February 2008

During the summer break there was plenty of competition for the swimmers including a very busy State Championships at Homebush. Willoughby swimmers performed with distinction at this event, bringing home gold medals from both the pool and open water categories.

STATE AGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Emma Morgan excelled in the 12/under events winning gold in the 11 years 100m and 200m Freestyle, along with silver in the 11/under 200m Backstroke. Emma also placed 4th in both the 200IM and 100m Backstroke, earning her a likely place in the NSW 12 and under IM Squad for 2008.

Ben Schafer placed top ten in his 12 years 100m Fly with a fast 1:11.73, and also ranked in the top 20 in all his events, placing 11th in the 200m free with another big personal best. Brooke McConnell made a number of p.b.'s in 200m Free and 100m Back, also making the State's top 20.

In the 13-18 years Championships, finalists performed every night of the 5 day meet. Luane Rowe again enjoyed success with Gold in the 17-18 800m, Silver in the 400m and Bronze in the 200m freestyle. Dylan Curtis improved from heats to finals in both his 100m Silver in 52.92 and 50m Bronze with 24.43, demonstrating the importance of good mental control in the big races. Dylan was

close to winning the double in a very competitive age division. Linley Dundas also enjoyed the racing opportunities earning silver in her 50m freestyle and creating a new club record in the 100m with a 59.80.

Other finalists included Sam McConnell 4th in his 100m Fly, 8th in the 50m Free and 10th in 100m back, Carla Rowe 5th in the 17/18 200m fly and 7th in the 800m Free, and Claire McConnell 9th in the 14 years 100m free.

Genevieve Brewer, Kieren Gromowski, Antony Isiaias, Jake Nolan and Emily Chancellor also achieved top 20 places in NSW in the 2008 Summer Series, where some of our best results were in the relay events.

Our Open 10 x 50m teams swam fast throughout – our men averaging 26.16 and women 29.61, both finishing 12th in the State. In the Age events the 13-14 Boys placed 7th in the Free Relay and 8th in the Medley with Kieren Gromowski, Antony Isiaias, Max and Nate Elliff making up both teams. The 15-16 Girls Free Relay comprising Linley Dundas, Carly Brewer, Martina Stokes and Emily Chancellor finished 13th, and the same team 16th in the Medley Event. The 15-16 years Boys also made top 20 in both relays; Brad Nolan, Dylan Curtis, Max Collins and Elliott Brown combining in both events. Our 13-14 years Girls narrowly missed top 20 placing 21st in the Freestyle with Genevieve Brewer, Claire McConnell, Steph Cannell and Lucy Mason, with Caitlin Wallington contributing in the Medley.

OPEN WATER

Our Open Water team is fast growing, and Rudy enjoyed assisting these swimmers at Penrith achieve our best ever results in the 5km and 10km events.

SPEEDO SPRINTS

The Speedo Sprint Series is also scheduled for Sunday with a 3pm warm-up for 3:30 start. I am really excited about this chance for our youngsters to flex their competitive spirit at Homebush – we have more than 40 swimmers entered this year – a record!

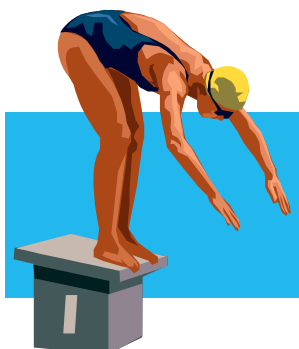
FINAL COUNTDOWN

State Age Open Water Championships

A miserable, wet Saturday greeted Willoughby's swimmers at the Penrith Regatta Centre for the NSW Open Water Championships. The 5km race provided some outstanding results.

Luane Rowe (18) competing in the Open event finished 4th overall in 1:01.06. Although she was 2nd fastest NSW and fastest 17/18 NSW.

Max (14) and Nathan (14) Elliff were up next, with Max 16th in 1:10.54 and Nathan 19th in 1:11.43. Both now achieving national qualifying times.

Max Collins (15) and Emily Chancellor Rudy (16) completed the day with both

finishing 10th in their age group, Max 1:04.23 and Emily 1:09.07 less than 2 minutes from placing top 3.

Sunday brought better weather for the 10km event with Max Collins (15) providing the highlight of the weekend finishing 1st NSW in the 14/15 years age group in 2:13:27, and Luane Rowe (18) 2nd in the Open Event in 2:06.08 and was fastest 16/18 years NSW.

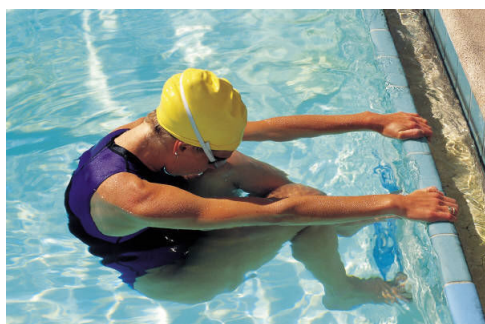

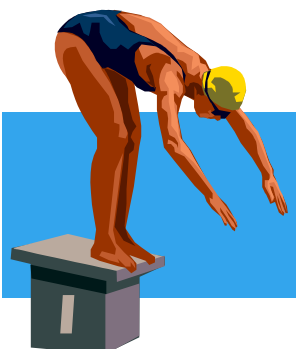

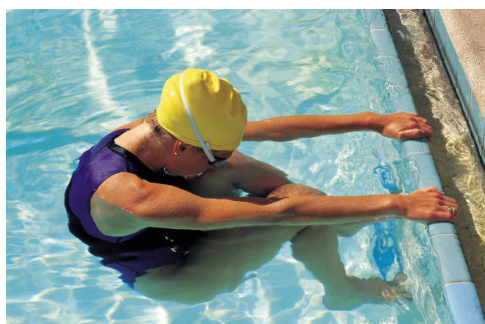
